When should you engage an ecologist?

When starting a new project it's always a good idea to get some initial advice from an ecologist to ensure that your development is sensitive to any ecological constraints and to smooth the consenting process. Here's a list of the key things to look for that should trigger you to contact us.

Wetlands: The NPS-FM and NES-F

So many acronyms! What do they mean?

The National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management (NPS-FM) and National Environmental Standards for Freshwater (NES-F) regulate activities that occur in or near streams and natural inland wetlands.

Both of these documents were amended earlier this year and ecologists now have much clearer guidance on how to classify natural inland wetlands, particularly in pastoral landscapes.

If there are any streams, drains, or damp/swampy/wet areas on your site you'll need to have these assessed to determine how they should be classified against the stream and wetland definitions in the Auckland Unitary Plan and the NPS-FM.

Depending on how these areas are classified, you may need to factor in wetland buffers, riparian yards, and fish management for your proposal, and you may need to pay close attention to stormwater management to ensure that there are no changes to the hydrological functions of wetlands in the catchment.

Significant Ecological Areas (SEAs)

If any areas on your property are covered by an SEA overlay, get us to take a look. SEA boundaries have generally been mapped as a desktop exercise using aerial photography, so it is worthwhile to get an ecologist to assess the actual ecological value of the area.

Other Vegetation

Vegetation that isn't classified as an SEA can still provide good habitat for indigenous fauna species, which may be protected under the Wildlife Act (1953). You may need to consider how you will manage adverse effects on lizards, birds, and bats that utilise otherwise low value vegetation such as rank grass or large old pine trees or macrocarpa. We can plan and implement a range of fauna survey and salvage projects for a diverse range of species.
